Push Stroke or Pull Stroke with PUK Saws?

Saw frames usually work with a push stroke, which means the teeth of the saw blades are directed away from the handle.

However, our saw frames PUK 300, 305, 2000, 2200 and PUKY don't have a tensioning screw, because the blade is fixated by the saw frame's own tension, so the blade's teeth should show towards the handle. When sawing by a push stroke, the saw blade may loosen, should the saw frame get bulged too much while sawing. Thus, the saw blade may unhinge and be a risk of injury to the user.

We therefore recommend to always use our a.m. saw frames as pull strokes saws.

Our new PUK Vario series is different: They have to be used as push stroke saws, so the saw blade's teeth have to be directed away from the handle.
